**JAZZ FESTIVAL**

There's an obvious dead-on intensity about tenor saxophonist Jed Levy. He too began on alto sax before the artistry of Cannonball Adderley seduced him. "At 13, I had the luck to chance on an album of Adderley's greatest hits," says Levy. "Soon, I was hearing tenor sax sounds clear and strong in my mind. I couldn't wait to take them as far as humanly possible."

While attending New England Conservatory of Music, Levy became a student of pianist Jaki Byard. After graduating in 1980, Levy played in Byard's ensembles. "Jaki's been my greatest influence," Levy asserts. "He showed me how to respect the tradition without imitating it on the bandstand. You've got to let your own personality color the music."
